



Return-Shipment of Lithium-Ion-Batteries

For a secure return shipment of Lithium-Ion-Batteries, the following instructions must be followed carefully:

For Seafreight and Road Shipments:

Packaging:

Make sure that the batteries are protected against a possible short-circuit and inner-packaging!

Whenever possible, please use the original packaging with carton and foam inlays. When that is not possible, then please use a stable carton and enough packaging material to assure the appliance is secured.

Marking:

When using the original packaging, please check that the dangerous-goods-labels are in good condition and easily readable. If they are not, or you used your own carton, please ensure to use the necessary dangerous goods label with proper shipping information and attach it to the broadside of the box. (UN3480, Part-nr. V-919012). The minimum dimensions of the label are 120mm x 110mm.

For Airfreight only:

According to the IATA-DGR, the shipment of Lithium-Ion-Batteries is classified as a Dangerous Good Class 9. Packaging.

Please see the IATA Packing Instruction VA965 IB.

Make sure that the batteries are protected against a possible short-circuit and inner-packaging.

For Airfreight shipments, you have to use a UN-tested Fiberboard-box (4G). Please make sure to use enough packaging-material, enough packaging material that the appliance is secured.

Marking:

Please use the necessary labels (UN3480, Part-nr. V-919012; Class 9 and CAO - Cargo Aircraft only). The minimum dimensions of the UN3480 and the CAO label are 120mm x 110mm and for the Class 9 it is 100mm x 100mm

In addition, the shipper and consignee and the net weight **must be on the same side.**



Documentation:

You have to fill out a Dangerous Good Declaration according to the IATA-Law.

What to do if the battery is damaged?

DO NOT SHIP DAMAGED BATTERIES! It is not permitted by law. Damaged batteries must be disposed of at your local recycling depot.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The sender is responsible for safely and correctly packing and labeling the package. The sender is also responsible for the documentation and declaration of the lithium-ion-battery according to the applicable dangerous goods laws.
